Born into one of Africa's most influential musical dynasties, Mádé Kuti is redefining the sound and spirit of modern Afrobeat for a new generation. As the son of Femi Kuti and grandson of the iconic Fela Kuti, Made carries a legacy that helped shape global music—but his voice is unmistakably his own.

A gifted multi-instrumentalist, composer, and producer, Mádé Kuti blends traditional Afrobeat with elements of jazz, highlife, soul, and contemporary global sounds to create music that is both deeply rooted and forward-thinking. His debut album, *For(e)ward*, released as part of the critically acclaimed double project *Legacy+* alongside his father, marked a bold introduction—fusing intricate arrangements with fearless lyricism tackling corruption, inequality, and social consciousness.

Raised within the walls of the legendary New Afrika Shrine in Lagos, Mádé's artistry was shaped by live performance, activism, and an unfiltered connection to the audience. From a young age, he mastered multiple instruments—including saxophone, piano, guitar, and drums—developing a sound that is as technically impressive as it is emotionally resonant.

In 2025, Mádé Kuti further defined his artistic identity with the release of his sophomore album, *Chapter 1: Where Does Happiness Come From?*. A 13-track, fully self-driven project, the album marks his first independent body of work—written, co-produced, and led entirely by him.

But beyond heritage, Made Kuti stands as a cultural force in his own right. His music is driven by purpose—challenging systems, amplifying youth voices, and pushing Afrobeat into new sonic territories. With electrifying live performances and a growing global audience, he represents the evolution of a genre that has always been about more than music—it is a movement.
