John H. Snow (1857-1939)

John Henry Snow was born in February 1857 in Newton, Massachusetts to Caroline (Crocker) and Henry Snow, a stair builder. Twice married, Snow's first wife Annie Weston passed away in 1899. In the spring of 1914, Snow married Elvira Adele Dearborn. They had no children.¹

While little information exists about the artist's life census records indicate that in 1880, Snow was residing in Cambridge where he was employed as a draftsman. He later moved to the town of Waltham where he worked as a draftsman in the engineering division of Waltham Public Works.² He resided in Waltham from around 1895 until his death in 1939.³

Today, Snow's work can be found in the Penobscot Marine Museum in Searsport, Maine.
