## THE FRENCH COUNTRY HOME WITH A REGENCY FLAIR

The first showcase home ever done by Thompson Custom Homes really made an impression. Featured in Beautiful Homes, the Robert Dame-designed home was French country with a Regency flair. The home, completed in 2005 and sold almost immediately, displayed all the character and charm of a vintage country estate but with all the modern-day features for comfortable living.
"I knew I wanted a house with character, built with materials that look like they had been reclaimed," Brian said. "I wanted it layered with a lot of texture inside and out."

The home was filled with lots of arched doorways and windows, paneled walls, painted and distressed cabinetry and furniture with a vintage feel. And despite being 7,000 square feet, the home still managed to maintain a level of intimacy.

In 2005, the building industry's premier residential design awards program took notice. Chuckanut was named the Best Custom Home and Best Master Bath in the Best in American Living Awards (BALA).

Since its completion, the home has been featured in national and international publications including Beautiful Homes (Fall 2005 and Summer 2009), Kitchen \& Bath Ideas (June/July 2006) and Casaviva (2014).

## longmont

Longmont was a study in balance. Heavy traditional bones combined with updated conveniences. Warm and cool elements. Old and new features.

For instance, take the stair hall that is lined with block paneling. In the 1920s, it would've been stained a dark color. But a fresh white paint lightens up the entry and gives it a crisp finish. The simple wrought iron railing indicates an updated style.

Long and narrow in design, the kitchen featured two islands that were used to break it up into zones - working and visiting. One island featured storage and a microwave; the other was open and perfect for prep work, serving or even socializing. The two sides of the kitchen also provided a contrast- open shelving and a range conducive to cooking up family meals on one side; a wall of built-in cabinets for dish display and storage on the other.

The kitchen won the Best in American Living Award in 2006 for Best Kitchen and featured earthy materials such as a green slate floor, reclaimed ceiling beams and dark walnut stained cabinetry that elevated the warmth. Additional coziness came from the double-sided stone fireplace in the breakfast area.

On the second floor, a sitting room in the primary bedroom provided additional privacy. The large symmetrical primary bath was designed to have a vintage appeal yet accommodate two people comfortably. Hand-beveled wood floors, a free-standing bathtub, custom vanities and an oversized shower featuring Carrera marble made this bathroom both sophisticated and understated.

The exterior featured a brown brick façade with a gable of stucco and timbers. A hand-carved limestone surround at the entry welcomed guests. The mix of window styles drew from traditional Tudor elements and slate tile roof, copper gutters added to the charm. A side courtyard featured the pool area and faced the covered patio, summer kitchen and outdoor fireplace.

Longmont was featured in multiple national publications, including Beautiful Homes (Fall 2006), Dream Kitchens (Fall/Winter 2007), Décor (Fall/Winter 2008) and Western Interiors (April/May 2009).

## THE CLASSIC MODERN ENGLISH TUDOR

A mix of styles is what made Cheska a showstopper. The bones of the home were English country and featured all the classic elements: traditional moldings and mantels, wall, window and ceiling treatments, an English-style stone façade. Family antiques sprinkled throughout the house gave the home an old-world feel.

But it's the chic elements that provided the juxtaposition. A checkerboard floor and storefront awning-style stainless steel vent hood in the kitchen. A white-painted branch chandelier in the dining room gave the room an artistic and edgy feel. A minimalist approach in patterns, fabrics and accessories was used throughout the 8,400 square-foot home.

The heart of the house was the kitchen and featured an island along with an antique table and chairs for casual family meals. "The room has great flow," Brian said. "There's plenty of what I call standing-around areas. Even with a full house, we're never crowded."

Just off the kitchen, a large sunroom provided the perfect hangout spot for kids and friends. And when a gathering calls for something more formal, the dining room provided the perfect ambiance: earthy green paneled walls, vintage oak floors and that branch chandelier paired well with a baby grand piano.

The exterior featured a heavy-English inspired stone façade and to counterbalance, runs of windows, French doors and transoms were added at every opportunity. In the back yard, the stone walled loggia offered views of the pool or a gathering space around the fireplace for those cool winter evenings.

The National Association of Homebuilders honored Cheska with the Best in American Living Award for Best Custom Home in 2007. The home was also featured on the covers of Traditional Home (April 2008) and Décor (Fall/Winter 2009) and featured in Beautiful Kitchens (Spring 2008).

With a lot that was wider than deeper, Thompson Custom Homes turned to the shotgun homes that are prominent in New Orleans for its inspiration. Little Lisa Lane was a side-loaded Acadian that blended the old with the new.
"What we always try to do with our showcase homes is do a different style and never repeat the style," Brian said. "With the lot being wide, it gave us a chance to build a 100 percent Acadian house."

A long hallway lined with doors overlooked the pool and courtyard space while connecting the different rooms of the house. The side yard also featured a loggia complete with summer kitchen, outdoor fireplace and entertaining area.

The exterior featured materials that were chosen for their long-lasting performance. From the slate tile roof to the reclaimed brick to the Cypress siding and exposed rafters, these finishes were both timeless and had the ability to age and increase in beauty over time.

The interiors of the home featured reclaimed original-faced wide plank pine salvaged from a grainery. The exterior brick was used on a wall that divides the living room and kitchen to add warmth to the rooms, as well as reclaimed beams throughout the house. Venetian plastered walls gave the home an old-world feel.

All bedrooms were on the second floor, leaving the entire main floor open for entertaining. The primary bedroom maintained its privacy from secondary bedrooms with a private sitting area and large private balcony overlooking the pool and loggia.

## THE CRISP AND CLEAN ACADIAN

From the exterior, Oak Lane looked like an old house that exuded character and charm. But a step inside revealed a home filled with all the modern amenities while maintaining a very warm, old cottage feel. Inspired by the French Creole style, this Acadian home was stacked and elongated to take advantage of the views of a creek in the back yard.

To keep the old home look, materials were chosen for their long-lasting performance and ability to age well and increase in beauty over the years. A slate tile roof, painted brick and antiqued siding were paired with copper gutters. Chain downspouts gave the home that extra piece of Southern charm.

Reclaimed wood was used on the floors and beams to give the home an older feeling. Plastered walls gave the home a softer feel. All the bedrooms were on the second floor, leaving the entire main floor open for entertaining. This included a large kitchen, great room, bar, game room and media room along with an expansive outdoor entertaining area. The master bedroom maintained its privacy from the secondary bedrooms and has spacious his and her bathrooms. Detached quarters above the second garage provided additional space for guests.

The heart of this home was the kitchen with its custom cabinetry, expansive countertops, ample guest seating and a large fireplace. A stainless-steel hood and light fixtures contrast with the classic white Carrara marble countertops. A large fireplace in the breakfast room provided a cozy location for extra seating.

The outdoor living area featured an exposed loggia, summer kitchen and large entertraining area. Several seating areas - whether in front of the fireplace or at a large dining table - made for memorable gatherings. The long back porch provided the perfect space for additional tables for big parties or family get-togethers. A beautiful copper hood and concrete countertops blend in with the style of the home.

One look into the backyard and you can see what immediately drew Brian Thompson to this lot. A rare site in the middle of the city, a large pond provided a tranquil backdrop for this home. So, the goal became simple: maximize the view from every room.

Inspired by Texas Hill Country, Robert Dame designed a home that could only be described as rustic with a modern twist. Texas limestone and a standing seam metal roof provided the rustic piece. Floor-to-ceiling steel windows gave the home a modern twist that took full advantage of the beautiful landscape.

The mash-up of rustic and modern continued on the interior. The rustic came from concrete countertops and old, reclaimed beams that were cut down for the wood floors. Plaster walls and flat panel cabinet doors and drawers, along with marble countertops added a modern flair.

The floating shelves and no upper cabinets gave the kitchen a cabin-like feel. Antique Belgium lights and exposed end-cut wood stairs provided warmth. A dozen skylights paired with the steel windowed allow natural light to flow heavily inside every room.

The home is loaded with special features. A car lift in the garage provided additional parking. Double ovens in the laundry room for the caterers to use during parties. A walk -in cooler with a freezer were installed in lieu of a traditional refrigerator. A downstairs bedroom was turned into an outfitter room, complete with a gun safe, a sink, countertop and garbage disposal designed for cleaning fish, storage for fishing and hunting gear and a place to wash the dog.

## THE NEW HOME MADE TO LOOK OLD

Designed to look like an older home that had been renovated, Willowend also created the ultimate entertainment experience with views that made the inside-to-outside transition effortless. Large rooms with wide, expansive openings allowed comfortable movement from space-to-space.

On the outside, traditional bones included a brick finish, large columns and shutters. But big-scale, large-format steel windows along the entire back of the home, slurried brick and copper gutters bring a transitional, updated feel to the home. The interiors featured clean lines, kerf doors and windows with minimal moldings.

Bold choices helped this house standout. Blue and maroon in the kitchen cabinets. A teal blue bedroom. Brass overlay doors. Custom-made wine room rack and stair railings. Fireplace mantles with bookended marble veining. Upholstered walls with brass nail-head trim in the game room.

The first floor delivers everything you need to accommodate crowds both large and small. A walk-in refrigerator and freezer and roomy pantry provided plenty of food storage. The game room was the perfect hangout spot where a sizeable bar and wine room anchor the space. The butler's pantry served double duty, acting as a serving area or second bar during a party. The spacious kitchen island invited guests to gather around for conversation and bites.

Upstairs, each of the bedrooms provided plenty of space to recover and relax from long days. The primary suite featured a luxurious bathroom complete with a soaking tub, steel-and-ribbed-glass doors on the shower and water closets, marble countertops and flooring. But it's the 315 -square-foot closet for the lady of the home that grabbed your attention. Glass-enclosed wardrobes, mirrored paneled walls, a packing island and makeup vanity will make any woman feel special.
