Current Creative Research

The Florida Barge Canal: Water, Progress, and a Slow Death investigates and photographs the long history of the defunct Florida Barge and Ship Canal. A trans-Florida canal would have theoretically saved merchants and the government time, money, and lives by avoiding the the southern tip of Florida. Throughout the canal's history, promoters and dissenters alike used the ideas of, progress, sustainability, and local interests to champion their cause. In the 1970's the canal was finally halted out of concern for Florida's aquifer. At 28% completion and a total cost 75 million dollars, it is the country's most expensive failed public works project and has left defunct dams, locks, reservoirs, and bridges all across the state of Florida.

Miniature Mysteries: Microphotographs, Encoding Methods and the Langenheim Brothers

This collaborative research project with Byron Wolfe investigates two rare 19th century microphotographs that depict a quarantine facility on Staten Island and shipping docks on Manhattan. Created by two 19th century photographers Frederick and William Langenheim, these peculiar microphotographs represent an early form of encoding but also establish links between the histories of immigration, mental health, photographic technology and the history of photography.

"Plain Ordinary Working People" a project featuring found Wal-Mart employee portraits from the 1980s. Using historical and social research methods a visual narrative is constructed from the found images. New pictures are made as a response to the found images, and certain individuals have been found and re-photographed, thirty years after the found images were taken.

Do Not Grow Weary is a three volume photobook which investigates the daily lives of three evangelical pastors through the lens of labor. This series also uses social research and statistics to show the struggle between pastoral responsibilities and their personal lives.
