- 80 per cent of the planet's remaining diversity is on the 15% of the world lived on by indigenous peoples,
- science proves that where indigenous communities are empowered to stay with their land, the biodiversity flourishes and the local culture flourishes – each protecting the other,
- by way of just one powerful example, for every ten square miles of forest that indigenous communities protect from being burnt down, they offset the annual carbon footprint of 300,000 people or 350,000 cars, and
- indigenous cultures are threatened every day with increasing wilderness destruction, urbanisation and economic duress and every two weeks an entire language dies
